



Dear Parent / Guardian,

We would like to bring your attention to the fact that your child's iPad currently has no restrictions set.

The default setting on an iPad allows full access to R18+ content, explicit lyrics, books, websites and 'adult' content. It also shares your iPad's exact location with others (right down to your home address which can be shown on a map) and allows in-app purchases or new apps to be downloaded (and charged to your account) without your permission.

Restrictions can easily be put in place to protect children from being exposed to this type of content and it is an expectation that all devices used at school have appropriate restrictions in place in order to protect other children.

In order to change restrictions please follow the following instructions.



1) Click on Settings



2) Click on General

3) Click on **Restrictions**. (Depending on the iOS (operating system) of the device, options will vary slightly.)

Enter a **Restrictions** passcode. (Your child should not know this code) *If you forget your code the iPad will need to be reset at the Mac Shop.*

(Scroll down)

Adjust the restrictions settings to 'Ratings for Australia'

Click on Music, Podcasts, Movies, TV Shows etc and change the restrictions on each tab to limit adult content.

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Click on Location Services and decide which apps are allowed to use your location and whether or not you want your child's iPad to 'share location' with others.

You may also decide to turn off 'Multiplayer games' in the game centre as your child may not know who they are interacting with online.

AirDrop allows the user to send or receive photos and files from 'Contacts Only' or 'Everyone'. *Everyone* means *anyone* within the range of your child's device.
